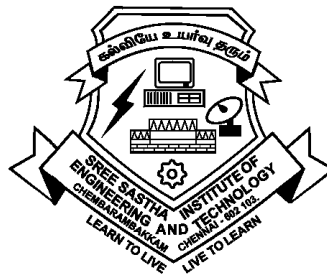

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Ragging – an offence

Ragging in any form, in any place or time is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including expulsion from the college, institution and university.

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazette – Extra ordinary dt. 29.01.97 (Bill No. B of 1997 Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act)

1. In this act, unless the context otherwise requires, “Ragging” means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes:-
 - a) Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on, or causing hurt to such student; or
 - b) Asking the student to act or perform something which such student will not, in the ordinary course, willingly act or perform.
2. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.
3. Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or propagates “Ragging” within or outside any educational institution shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to twenty thousand rupees.
4. Any Student convicted of an offence shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, whenever any student complains of ragging to the head of an educational institution, or to any other persons responsible for the management of the educational institution, such as head of the educational institution, or person responsible for the management of the educational institution, the concerned authority shall inquire into the same immediately and if found true, shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

Punishment for Ragging & Eve Teasing

Ragging in any form inside or outside the college is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment as per Bill No.8 of 1997, Tamil Nadu prohibition of Ragging Act

1. Ragging inside or outside the college shall be punished with imprisonment for a term of 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine of Rs. 20,000/-
2. Any student convicted under ragging shall also be dismissed from the Institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institutions in the country.
3. Any student suspected under ragging may be suspended from the Institution by the Head of the Institution or the person responsible for the management.
4. The decision of the Head of the Institution or the person responsible for the Management regarding the student who has indulged in ragging shall be final under sub section (i) of the above act.
5. Eve Teasing is prohibited and punishable under Tamil Nadu prohibition of Eve Teasing Act 1998.

REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES

Students are expected to abide by the following rules:

- Keep the classrooms and the institute campus neat and tidy.
- Be courteous to staff members and fellow students.
- Be punctual to classes.
- Keep the classrooms and the Institute campus neat and tidy
- Be courteous to staff members and fellow students.
- Should come in proper uniform to the Institution and to the laboratory classes.
- Should wear ID cards, when they are inside the campus.
- Should bring calculators, drawing instruments notebooks etc. as per the time-table.
- Experiments done in a laboratory class should be written in the Record notebook and should be submitted in the next laboratory class as per the instruction of the faculty in-charge.
- Should submit the assignments in time as instructed by the concerned faculty.
- Should not use their cell phone, pager within the campus.

DRESS CODE

- Pants with shirts tucked in, shoes and socks for boys.
- Saree, Salwar Kameez, Churidar with Dupatta and proper footwear for girls.
- Wearing of Jeans, T-Shirts and other casual wears by students is strictly prohibited.
- The students should wear uniform for laboratory classes as specified.

LEAVE REGULATIONS

- Students should apply for leave and get it sanctioned before proceeding on leave. In case of sickness, emergency leave letter has to be submitted immediately on return after the leave.
- Students should not absent themselves for more than three days continuously; they should come with their parents for sanction/ ratification of their leave.
- Students should not absent themselves for more than 5 days in a semester.
- The names of the students who absent themselves continuously for 15 days will be struck off from the rolls.
- Students should not be absent on the next day after SUNDAY / Any other declared holidays.

Use of Cell Phone

Use of cell phone by all students, faculty and staff members in our college especially inside and outside of Class rooms, Laboratories, Library, drawing halls, seminar halls, conference halls, and other academic areas is strictly prohibited during college hours.

However, taking into consideration of the fact and special request received from the students especially girls students and their parents, only basic cell phones are permitted to be used judiciously for genuine reasons in an emergency such as for sending message to their parents regarding their sudden ill health and late arrival due to Academic reasons with specific permission of the class i/c and HOD concerned. Otherwise, students should have their mobile phones switched off and out of sight during class hours.

COLLEGE EXAMINATIONS

- Students must be punctual and present for all the examinations.
- Borrowing of calculators, instruments or stationery items in the examination hall is not permitted.
- Copying in the examination hall will attract disciplinary action and debarring from further examinations.
- If a student is unable to attend a test due to valid reason, he/she is allowed to take the Retest.
- The Anna University has introduced internal Assessment marks 20% in each subject which is segregated into 60% for Unit Tests and 40% for Model Examinations.

CAMPUS RULES

- Drive slowly not exceeding 20 kmph limit.
- Noise pollution is an avoidable offence in the academic campus.
- No horn within the campus.
- Help to maintain the beauty, the serenity and greenery of the campus.
- Avail the dustbin facility.

- Triple riding in two wheelers is prohibited.
- Rash driving may result in the seizure of the vehicle.
- Driving without license is prohibited.

- Pasting of wall posters, writing on walls and roads are prohibited.
- Cars and Bikes are permitted to be parked inside the campus, for which necessary entry pass should be obtained from the main security office.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS AND ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

A candidate is permitted to appear for the University Examination of any Semester on condition that:

- He/She has secured a minimum of 75% attendance in the total number of working days during that semester.
- He/She earns a progress certificate from the Head of the Institution of having satisfactorily completed the course of study prescribed in the subjects as per norms.
- Ideally every student is expected to attend all classes and secure 100% attendance. However, in order to allow for certain unavoidable reasons such as Medical / Participation in sports / personal, the student is expected to attend at least 75% of the classes during any semester.
- Therefore, he/she shall secure not less than 75% of overall attendance taking into account the total number of 450 periods in a semester.
- However, a candidate who secures overall attendance between 65% and 74% in that current semester due to medical reasons (prolonged hospitalization / accident / specific illness / Participation in sports events) may be permitted to appear for the current semester examinations subject to the conditions.
- Candidates who secure less than 65% of overall attendance shall not be permitted to write the current University examinations papers at the end of the semester and will not be permitted to go to the next semester. They are required to repeat and redo the incomplete semester in the next academic year.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPEARING UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

A candidate shall normally be permitted to appear for the University examination of any semester if he / she has satisfied the semester completion requirements and has registered for examination in all courses of the semester. Registration is mandatory for semester examinations as well as arrears examinations failing which the candidate will not be permitted to move to the higher semester.

A candidate who has already appeared for subjects or any subject in a semester and has passed the examination is not entitled to reappear in the same subject or subjects of the semester for improvement of grades / marks

EXAMINATIONS

- Semester pattern is followed. Examination will be conducted both in theory and practical for all the semesters.
- Students should come to examination centre with their Hall Ticket and identity card.
- Programmable Calculators & Cell Phones are not allowed inside the examination hall.
- Students who indulge in malpractices will be debarred from the University Examination as per University Regulations.

Warning : Candidates guilty of any of the above mentioned malpractices will be debarred from writing exam for a period of three years, or dismissed from the course depending upon the gravity of their malpractice. The decision will be taken by the Controller of Examinations, Anna University Chennai.

SCHOLARSHIPS, LOANS AND FEE CONCESSION

NATIONAL LOAN SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarship is awarded by the Director of Collegiate Education, Tamil Nadu to the students based on their performance in the higher secondary course or its equivalent examination.

Scholarships for SC/ST Students

- a) Government of India Post-matric Scholarship for SC/ST candidates: The parental annual income should not exceed Rs.2, 50,000/- The District Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Office, Tiruvallur sanctions the scholarship.
- b) Gandhi Memorial Scholarship: The District Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Office awards the scholarship. It is awarded on the basis of the merit of the students in the previous year of study.
- c) Adi-Dravidar Welfare Loan: This loan is awarded by the Adi-Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department to the SC/ST students who are residing in the hostel, in addition to the Government of India Scholarship.

Scholarship for Backward Class and Most Backward Class students

The scholarship is awarded by the Director of Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes, Thiruvallur, as the case may be. The Parental annual income should not exceed Rs. 2, 00,000/-. For SC/ST/SCC/SAC, the annual income should not exceed Rs. 2,500,000/-.

Scholarship for the Ward of Beedi, Mine & Cine Workers

The scholarship is awarded by the Ministry of Labour, Govt. of India to the wards of Beedi / Mine & Cine workers. The Parental monthly income should not exceed Rs. 25,000/- for Beedi workers, Rs. 25,000/- for Mine workers and Rs. 25,000 for Cine workers.

Parents Teacher Meet:

In the interest of welfare of the students and to enhance their academic performance, the Parents and Teachers Meet is being conducted at our Institution by having an interaction session between parents and teachers every year.

LIBRARY

The Library was started with an initial stock of 6987 books in 1999 and now the total has reached around 39,000 volumes in various subjects. The books are widely used by the faculty members and the students of the PG and UG courses. The Library subscribes to a number of periodicals on various subjects. A comprehensive database of Library books has been created.

LIBRARY TIMINGS

The Library serves the users from 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. on all working days.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students are advised to use the Library facilities, adhere to the following Library Rules:

- Students are required to show their ID cards to the Security while entering the Library and sign in the “Gate Register” kept at the entrance.
- No student is allowed to bring his/her personal belongings inside the Library.
- Students are expected to maintain strict discipline when they are in the Library.
- Students are issued 2 Borrower’s cards to borrow book from the Library. One book will be issued on each card.

- Books are issued for a period of 14 days. Books should be returned on or before the due date.
- Students are required to produce their ID cards while borrowing the books from the Issue Counter.
- Reservation for books can be made by using the reservation form.
- Students are advised not to disturb the sequence of arrangement of books in the racks.
- Students are required to return the books before they appear for the University Examinations and collect “No Due Certificate” from the Librarian.
- Library book lost by the user should pay the book cost along with triple the cost of the book. The multiple of the book cost will be changed from time to time as per library holdings and revised accordingly.

This is applicable for staff of the college also;

- When a book is lost or damaged, the students shall replace the book with the latest edition and pay the overdue charges till the date of replacement. If the lost book is not available in the market, the student will have to pay triple the cost of the lost book within a week.
- Loss of Borrower’s Card should be reported to the Librarian immediately in writing. An application requesting for the Duplicate Borrower’s Card(s) should be made to the Librarian by the concerned student. Rs. 25 will be charged for each Duplicate Borrower’s Card. He/She has to give an undertaking in a prescribed format available in the Library, for the possible misuse of the lost Borrower’s Card by any other student. Duplicate Borrower’s Card(s) will be issued after a week from the date of request.
- For any book borrowed from the library, the cardholder is held responsible. The cardholder, in whose name the book is issued, is responsible for proper upkeep of the book till it is returned.
- Borrower’s card is not transferable.
- Reference Books will not be lent.
- Personal books are not allowed inside the Library.

MEN'S HOSTEL

The men's hostel located in the college premises accommodates 800 students of both U.G. and P.G. The hostel consists of 80 well ventilated rooms providing a serene atmosphere for studying and overall development.

Discipline is the key word of the hostel. The warden is at the service of the inmates all the time to cater to their needs in the hostel. Every floor has a recreation hall with provision for TV and indoor games. The canteen serves nutritious and delicious, meals, snacks and beverages at a reasonable cost. Special timings are allotted to the inmates to access the internet facility available in the college premises.

WOMEN'S HOSTEL

The newly constructed women's hostel within the college Campus accommodates 400 students of both UG and PG with proper supply of electricity and water. The hostel is equipped with recreation hall, TV, indoor games; the hostellers are encouraged to avail the internet facility after the college working hours. (From 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.)

HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATION

- The admission to the hostel is restricted to bonafide students of Sree Sastha Institute of Engineering and Technology & PG studies.
- Parent / Guardian, who will comply strictly with the hostel rules and formalities of admission, shall accompany the students seeking admission into hostels. No accommodation is guaranteed. Admission to hostels will be on a first come first served basis. However, the college authorities shall take all possible efforts to provide accommodation.
- Every student admitted to the hostel shall pay caution deposit, which will be refunded at the end of the course. The mess charge, room rent and establishment charges will be notified from time to time and the same may be paid without delay.
- Admission to the hostel is made for one year only with no right to admission for the next year. The warden has every right to refuse admission or expel anyone without assigning any reason. Detained students will not be provided accommodation.
- No student is allowed to stay in the hostel without the prior approval of the college authorities.
- The allotment of room shall not be changed without the prior approval of the warden, in writing.

- No student is allowed to vacate the hostel in the middle of an academic year. If it is done, the room rent and amenities charges will not be refunded.
- Inmates of the hostel are expected to be in their rooms by 7.00 PM. All gates will be closed by 7.00 PM. Otherwise disciplinary action will be taken against those coming after 7.00 PM. Inmates will not be permitted to enter or leave the hostel after this time. Attendance roll call would be taken at 8.30 PM daily. Those who would like to be away for any specific reason should obtain prior permission of the principal to do so. Study hours are mandatory between 8.30 PM. – 10.30 PM. Strict silence must be maintained during the study hours and the students should be in their rooms only.
- No women can be entertained in the men's hostel and vice versa.
- Cleanliness has to be maintained in the hostel rooms, toilets and the college premises.
- All the occupants of a room are equally responsible for any damage, loss of furniture, etc. and in such cases the cost will be recovered through a collective fine system.
- Permission should be obtained from the warden for use of table fan, any other electrical appliances, computer, etc.
- Hostel inmates shall not organize or address meeting in the hostel without prior permission of warden / principal.
- Consumption of drugs, alcohol, smoking and chew of pan are strictly prohibited in the campus.
- In case of serious illness and infections diseases, students should report the same to the concerned resident warden for necessary action.
- Playing cards or any other form of gambling is strictly prohibited in the hostel and birthday celebrations are not permitted.
- Hostel students will not be allowed to stay back at hostel during college working hours.
- Sick students will be allowed to stay back at hostel during college hours after obtaining prior written approval from the Principal.
- The main entrance of the hostel will be locked after 8.30 a.m and unlocked at 3.30 p.m in all college working days.
- The time schedules prescribed for dining should be strictly adhered to by every hostel student.

- Every hostel student should ensure that his/her room is locked properly before leaving hostel on every occasion.
- Hostel students can submit their requirements if any, to the Hostel Committee to redress their grievances at all times.
- Requirement for academic special classes can also be brought to the attention of the faculty concerned by the hostel students
- Hostel students should get prior written permission from the undersigned before leaving the hostel on any occasion.
- Every hostel student should sign in the Movement Register available at the Principal's Office while leaving or entering the hostel always.
- During holidays the movement of every hostel student should be endorsed in the Movement Register available at Principal's office on the very next working day at par with the entry made in the hostel movement register without fail.
- As per Supreme Court orders and in accordance with rules and regulations of UGC/AICTE, the ragging is totally prohibited in this Institution and any one found guilty of ragging and/ or abetting ragging whether actively or passively or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging is liable to be punished with imprisonment for a term of 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine of Rs.20,000/- Any student convicted under ragging shall also be dismissed from the Institution and such a student shall not be admitted in any other educational institutions in the country
- The student should not leave mobile, ornaments and other valuables unguarded.
- A hosteller is expected to stay in the hostel till the completion of the academic year.
- In exceptional circumstances, other than disciplinary cases, one month's notice is necessary in case a student desires to vacate the hostel.
- Mess Timings shall be strictly adhered to by all hostellers.
- The hostel students are permitted to go home, outing and for parents visit in Sundays restricted as per Circular No. SSIET/Hostel/2012, dt.5.10.2012.
- The student shall not bring and/or keep any pets in the premises including fish, cats, dogs and the like.
- Day scholars will not be allowed into Hostel / Mess on any account.

- In addition to penalties, punishment and fine provided in these Rules, Disciplinary action as per the Institute code of Conduct shall be taken against student violating these Hostel Rules and Regulations.
- The hostel students who are using Computer/Laptop will have to pay the annual fees as prescribed by the College.
- The Welfare/Mess Committees constituted for hostel students will monitor and redress the grievances then and there

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND FACILITIES

Each branch of engineering has a separate technical association and experts from respective fields are invited to deliver lectures and conduct seminars. To enhance the technical knowledge of students, they are taken for industrial visits.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Alumni Association took shape during April 2003 with the first batch of UG courses students exhibiting keen interest to continue their association through mutual communication and also for upholding the institution's name. The Alumni Association has been named as "The Heritage markers".

WOMEN'S CELL

A Women's cell has been formed in this college with the following objectives:

- To provide equality of opportunity to women students for their participation in the activities of college department.
- To enhance better career prospects for women students by ensuring an atmosphere that is free from the fear of sexual harassment.
- To open new avenues of opportunities to women through financial and emotional empowerment leading to the pruning of their individuality.

CANTEEN/ MESS

A medical unit with a doctor functions in the main building between 2.00 and 5.00 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday for consultation purposes of students and faculty. A nurse will be available for service on all working days between 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m.

SEMINAR HALL

A modern Air Conditioned Seminar Hall with all facilities including executive chairs, public address system, LCD, OHP and Sound System have been set up for delivering seminar in a convenient and effective manner.

COMPUTER & INTERNET FACILITY

Our College possesses very high-end and sophisticated computer laboratories for various departments. Totally about 800 computer systems from top MNC brands are spread across 10 labs. All the computer labs have dedicated servers and inter connectivity. Printing devices are available in all the laboratories. Lipi line printer (600 LPM) is available for bulk printing. During the examination period based on the students the computer labs are kept open till 6 PM for the students' online practice.

Internet bandwidth of 10 Mbps is available through a dedicated leased line from Aircel. Internet facility is provided to all the students, faculty and staff at free of cost. Internet facility is provided to the hostel students after college hours upto 6 PM.

PROCTORAL SYSTEM

A group of students are assigned to the care of a staff member (Proctor) who guides and monitors them on academic and personal matters.

Stimulating the Gurukul environment for learning, the proctorial system envisions an interactive human relationship between the teacher and the taught. The proctor has the role and responsibility to nurture a group of nascent youngsters for their all round development as good human beings. The proctorial system enables close monitoring of the student's progress in terms of his attendance, punctuality, performance and learning capabilities as part of the curricular requirements. It helps provide the fresher a sense of security, bonhomie, elderly guidance, counseling and in the process remove the feelings of alienation and homesickness. It enriches the interaction so essential for the teaching-learning environment and embellishes it with a human touch. The proctorial system serves as a single window system wherein parents or guardians can easily monitor their ward's progress through their respective proctors.

Proctors at all levels are allocated to a group of students at random, irrespective of their programme of study, caste, creed, gender or religion.

TRAINING AND PLACEMENT CELL

To enhance the employability of our students after graduation, adequate industry institution programmes are provided to the pre-final and final year students.

Counseling is also done for their career along with higher education orientation.

Aptitude tests and group discussions form an essential part of the current activities.
